

Big Seed Happenings, September, 2018

Welcome families to the Big Seed room! Here is what you can expect every month in your child's new classroom. Each month we do a curriculum centered on a study that is developmentally age-appropriate with centers and activities that will build skill sets in the five areas of development: physical, language, cognitive, social-emotional and mathematics. Look for our monthly newsletter that will highlight what the children learned and what piqued their curiosity in that month. It will also include a brief overview of what we will be studying the following month. This will include the theme, books, songs and a written description of our American Sign Language (ASL) signs. These signs will be everyday words that will complement our monthly study. We will have a circle time which is a great tool to help build bonds between peers and adults.

As a part of our move towards Conscious Discipline, (social-emotional development) we will be introducing mindfulness activities throughout the center. We live in a busy world full of triggers that engage our senses and at times it can be very overwhelming, especially for children. Mindfulness activities are a great way to help children center themselves and their focus on one thing at a time. Even if it is only for a few minutes throughout the day, the practice of mindfulness will help to develop a child's self-regulation skills as well as build their self-confidence. Every art project, every inside/outside activity, the language we use and even the toys we put out is done with the intention of developing your child's mind and body. We look forward to working with you in accomplishing the goals that together we have set for your child.

This September come and "Bust-a-Rhyme" in the Big Seed room with some "oldies-but-goodies" nursery rhymes and maybe even a few new ones. Make sure to take a few minutes to check out your child's art displayed throughout the classroom as we get further into the month.
